
Kentucky Calls in to See, Hear Provost Students

The U.S.A. students also got to peek inside the classroom at PPS and hear what was happening during the international hour long learning session that was mainly held to get acquainted and test the system over a long distance.

There were about 10 students at PPS who first made a general presentation to the Kentucky students with distance education teacher Jennifer Romanchuk Dewberry also in the room. Romanchuk is one of the distance teachers in the school division as is Brad Pylypow of Provost who teachers physics over the distance edu-

PPS students showed a video of school life and told generally about the Town of Provost and included some supporting slides about the economy.

After that presentation 31 students from Kentucky along with their teacher Pam Bishop made a presentation to PPS which also included a video of their school. The students showed other video clips and talked about books that they

There was then a general question and answer time held.
