What goes up . . . must come down. AGT crews are dismantling the last remaining open-wire long distance line in Alberta. The 62-mile section between Stettler and Drumheller was built in 1912 and at one time over 30thousand miles of lines criss-crossed Alberta carrying long distance messages. But sleet storms were the bane of open wire. A vicious ice-storm in 1932 knocked out service over most of central and southern Alberta and cost hundreds of thousands of dollars to repair. Then in 1957 the first microwave system arrived and in 1964 AGT launched a massive buried cable program. Pole lines were on the way down . . . and out. Today Albertans make 400-thousand long distance calls on an average day. Open wire could never have met the demand.
